Update on Dominion Lecture

Kathy asked the Dominion Lecture committee to vote on top choices after suggestions were made by Caucus members. Kimberlé Crenshaw is the top choice. She is an American civil rights advocate and a leading scholar of critical race theory. She is a full professor at the UCLA School of Law and Columbia Law School, where she specializes in race and gender issues. She is known for the introduction and development of intersectional theory, the study of how overlapping or intersecting social identities, particularly minority identities, relate to systems and structures of oppression, domination, or discrimination. She has written several books.

We hope to schedule the lecture in mid-September. Kristi will email Ms. Crenshaw this week to see if she's interested in speaking at JMU.

Update on allyship

Kristen Shrewsbury gave an update on allyship. A committee has been developed for this purpose. She is the chair. The Caucus has been working on it since the fall and has met with several individuals at JMU (Gail Napora, James Robinson, Amy Sirocky-Meck) and in the community (Tim Ruebke). We plan to meet with Marilou Johnson before the semester ends.

The purpose of the group is to connect as an ally and serve as a resource. The mission is to listen actively and compassionately to constituent concerns in order to assist in connecting the individual to the host of options available for recourse at JMU. We hope to start offering allyship in the fall.

Other business

The *Training Rules* film screening has been postponed until the fall. The library has ordered the DVD and secured the rights to show the film. Jennifer Harris, featured in the film, will be present after the screening for a Q&A/discussion. She has been notified that we're moving the event to fall, possibly mid-late October.

The film focuses on the women's basketball program at Pennsylvania State University under head coach Rene Portland and her policy of discrimination on her players based on their sexual orientation over a 27-year period as coach of the university's basketball program, particularly from the 1980s to the late 1990s.

Training Rules was suggested to us by Sue Rankin, 2016 Dominion lecturer. Jennifer Harris, featured in the film, later transferred to JMU to play basketball and majored in Psychology.
